HONORS PROGRAM

To be eligible to apply for the Honors Program, a student must:

- Have a cumulative GPA of 3.20 or higher
- Have a GPA of 3.50 or higher in courses required for the psychology major
- Have a working relationship with one of the participating faculty with an established research question that you will be able to answer in a one-year project
- Be a junior psychology major in their 2nd semester
