Pre-Congress at Centre ValBio for 30th IPS Congress

Centre ValBio hosted Pre-Congress of the 30th International Primatological Society (IPS) Congress, which was in Madagascar this year.

Fifteen students of primates from 12 countries attended five days of field classes at Centre ValBio on community involvement in



conservation, primate field methods and ethics, new technology such as Minions to test DNA in the field, thermal drones, ultrasonic field acoustic monitors, and programmable GIS collars.

Tatyana Humle (France) and Zimbo Boonratana (Malaysia) supervised the Pre-Congress group. This was the first time most of the participants saw lemurs in the wild.

Choosing Madagascar to host IPS highlighted the critical importance of this unique island nation, which is home to 112 species of lemurs – all of which are found nowhere else on Earth.



Forest Corridor Project

The Forest Corridor Project includes a research component in addition to its community engagement and reforestation activities. This past month, a team of 13 people traveled to the remote village of Ampitambe to meet with Conservation Club members and villagers involved in tree planting.

An important addition to this expedition was soil sampling, which was carried out both within the Ambaromena forest fragment, a 40-minute hike from Ampitambe, and at the reforestation sites. Biodiversity surveys focusing on insects, plants, and herpetofauna were also conducted under the lead of CVB researchers, including soil expert Ellasun Chamberlain, and



CVB staff, including Rajerison Emile and Razafindrabe Dominique.
