#### **Eligibility**

- Admission to Stony Brook University Department of Economics Ph.D. Program
- Belonging to an historically underrepresented group in the field of economics, including minorities and women
- US Citizen or Permanent Resident

#### Qualifications

- High GPA in STEM based major
- Strong academic record and background in mathematics
  - Calculus
  - Linear algebra
  - Real Analysis
- Scoring high on GRE Quantitative
- Supportive letters of recommendation
- Strong personal statement

Our Ph.D. program is a small, highly selective and tightly focused. Graduate training begins with a sequence of core courses in the student's first two semesters. After core training in the first year, students choose their major and minor areas of specialization for second year study. Course work is capped by sitting for comprehensive examinations. Once a student passes the comprehensive exams, they embark on dissertation work. Among our specialized areas of concentration, students at Stony Brook may select from: Game Theory, Macroeconomics, Public Policy and Macro Finance, Industrial Organization, Labor Economics, Economic Demography, and Health
