Gala Honoring Dr. Marilyn Hawrys Simons Raises Record \$28.2 Million

More than 800 guests gathered on Wednesday, April 10 at Pier Sixty at Chelsea Piers in New York City to honor alumna and Simons
Foundation President Marilyn Hawrys
Simons '74, PhD '84, at the 20th Stars of Stony Brook Gala.

Hosted annually by the Stony Brook Foundation Board of Trustees, this year's celebration recognized Dr. Simons for her leadership as president of one of the nation's premier philanthropic institutions devoted to driving progress in basic science, as well as her contributions to improving educational opportunities for the underserved at the university and beyond.

The 2019 Stony Brook Gala also proved to be a record-breaker, raising an astounding \$28.2 million. The total included \$25 million from Dr. Simons, which will establish a new Center for Applied Economics and Public Policy at the University and another record-breaking \$3.2 million plus was raised for student scholarships.

"This incredible gift will transform our economics department, " said University <u>President Samuel L. Stanley Jr.</u>, " and positively impact programs campus wide, enhancing Stony Brook's voice in public policy and bolstering the worldwide reputation of the university. I am humbled by Marilyn's vision, generosity and confidence in Stony Brook."

Students, faculty and staff were among more than 400 people who showed up in the Student Activities Center to hear Governor Andrew Cuomo provide a Long Island overview of the 2019-2020 New York State Budget. Highlights included making the two-percent property tax cap permanent, which he says will save the average Suffolk County taxpayer \$58,000 as well as a new internet sales tax for out-of-state business that will generate \$45.3M in new tax revenue for both Nassau and Suffolk Counties.

The first of two of Stony Brook Medicine's <u>Mobile Stroke Units</u> has been dispatched for service - the only such mobile technology of its kind on Long Island.

This state-of-the-art vehicle will be stationed off of Exit 57 on the Long Island Expressway and dispatched by Suffolk County 911 operators whenever responding to a potential stroke victim. The Stony Brook Mobile Stroke Response Team will be able to begin immediate diagnosis and necessary treatment in emergency situations where every second counts. A second vehicle will be stationed off of Exit 68 when it is put into service.

Issues discussed during the meeting included re-authorization of the Higher Education Act, increased student financial aid, a permanent solution for DACA recipients, increased federal investment for scientific research, and the need for a bipartisan budget agreement to lift the Budget Control Act's harmful discretionary caps in FY20 and FY21. II Memming Park Wins \$200K Stony Brook Discovery Prize

<u>Dr.II Memming Park</u> and three Stony Brook early career research colleagues took the stage and presented their high-risk, high-reward concepts to a panel of prestigious judges at the 2019 <u>Discovery Prize</u> competition in the Charles B.
