










Summer in Greece Faculty-led



- The Summer Abroad program in Greece offers a unique opportunity to earn 6 academic credits and experience Greece with SBU faculty and classmates!
- Combines classroom study of the Greek language, history, literature, and culture and field trips to introduce students to many aspects of life in Greece.
- Special emphasis is placed on visiting and experiencing significant monuments and historical sites







Summer Abroad Courses



2 courses

GRK 121 Elementary Modern
Greek I - students engage in
learning and conversing in Modern
Greek at a basic level (3 credits)

EUR 447 Selected Readings in European Studies - students explore and become familiar with Greek history and culture, from the ancient times to present day (3 credits)

Students earn 6 academic credits that count toward their degree requirements at SBU

- Language Credit part 1 EXP
- Upper Division 3 Credits

These credits fulfill major or minor requirements








Program Description

- Some days will be devoted to the Greek Language course (GRK121) and/or the Selected Readings Course (EUR447)
- The students will be learning about the places that will be visited and their importance prior to the visits both through EUR447 or by local guides
- Other days will be devoted entirely to field trips and excursions.

- Personal expenses & food/entertainment



Exploring Athens

The program's included trips and excursions are designed to encourage students to discover and experience modern Greece. Activities include walking tours of Athens, visits to monuments and museums, evening outings, and a half-day trip to Attica's beautiful coastline as Poseidon's temple at Cape Sounio.











Excursions & Day Trips

*the dates of individual trips are still tentative

Students will visit major historical sites and museums in Athens, two different islands, Aegina and Spetses, as well as the town of Nafplio.

All of the above are part of the curriculum, and attendance is required. Students may travel to other parts of Greece on their own <u>after</u> the SBU program is finished.




















Program Highlights

Athens

Visit to the <u>Parthenon</u> and the <u>Acropolis Museum</u>. Visit and walk in the <u>Plaka</u> & <u>Monastiraki</u> area, explore some of the most important sites in Athens such as <u>Syntagma Square</u>, <u>Evzones and Changing of the guard</u>, <u>National Gardens and Zappeion</u>, <u>Panathenaic Stadium</u>/ <u>Kallimarmaro</u>, <u>Benaki Museum</u> and the <u>National</u> <u>Gallery of Art</u> (lectures on site).

Visit the <u>Temple of Aphaia</u> (lecture on site)
Visit the seaside village of <u>Agia Marina</u>,
and enjoy the sandy beach & Greek food





Nafplio

Tour of Nafplio's Old City / Visit to <u>Palamidi</u> and <u>Bourtzi</u> (lecture on site)

Day trips

Day trips to <u>Ancient Olympia</u>, the island of <u>Spetses</u>, <u>Corinthos</u>

<u>Bridge</u>, <u>Epidaurus Ancient Theater / Sanctuary of Asklepios at</u>

<u>Epidaurus</u> / <u>Mycenae</u> (lectures on the site)

Next Steps


- Apply for a passport, or make sure your passport is valid for at least 6 months beyond the start of the program.
