ⁱ **LIN 425 - Second language phonetics:** This class will introduce students to current research regarding the phonetic abilities of second language learners. The class will combine targeted readings with a hands-on approach in which students will learn about how experiments on second language pronunciation and perception are carried out, and will get firsthand experience doing phonetic analysis of real data that form part of ongoing projects in the Phonetics lab. Depending on student background and interest, the class may also design its own experiment so that students can learn about the research process from the beginning. Grading will be A-F and will be based primarily on work carried out as homeworks, with periodic quizzes to ensure students fully understand key concepts introduced over the course of the term.
